

2017 BIENNIAL REVIEW - DRUG AND ALCOHOL PREVENTION PROGRAM

The Drug and Alcohol Prevention Program is administered and reviewed by the CCU Student Services Department. Student Services is responsible for reviewing the requirements and goals of the Drug-free Schools and Campuses Regulations and collecting campus information to evaluate the program, review applicable benchmarking data from similar institutions, and produce the Biennial Review, including recommendations for future action.

This review will:

1. Determine the effectiveness and implement any needed changes to the program.
2. Ensure that CCU consistently enforces the disciplinary sanctions for violating standards of conduct.

All statistics used to review the program are taken from the university's Annual Security Report and records of student conduct. In compliance with FERPA, these statistics are gathered without disclosing the names of those involved.

Dual Copies of the Biennial Review will be kept on file in Human Resources and in Student Services for the purposes of employee/student reporting and accessibility. The Biennial Review can also be found on the CCU website.

A review of policy documents concludes the following:

1. The college appears to be in overall compliance with the regulations.
 - a. There is a program in place directed towards the prevention of illicit drugs and the misuse of alcohol and drugs.

- b. The program describes the legal sanctions for unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol.
- c. The program gives a clear statement of sanctions the college will impose on students and employees for violations of the standards of conduct.
- d. The program contains a description of the health risks associated with the use of illicit drugs and the abuse of alcohol.
- e. The program lists resources available on campus to those seeking help with drug or alcohol problems.

2. During the 2016-17 year, the Student Services Department utilized a broad range of disciplinary sanctions in regard to alcohol and drug abuse. Each of these sanctions was within the bounds of the written policies and was adjusted in consideration of the severity and repetition of any violations.

Effectiveness of the Drug and Alcohol Prevention Program

- 1. CCU had 9 marijuana use offenses (3 possession of marijuana on campus violations) and 8 alcohol use offenses in 2016-17, with no drug-related violent crime or theft.
- 2. A comparison to the latest data (2015) from Mount Saint Joseph University, a neighboring faith-based residential institution, showed similar rates of drug-related offenses (4), however alcohol-related offenses at CCU were very favorable (33).
- 3. A comparison to the latest data (2015) from Thomas More College, a neighboring faith-based residential institution, showed similar rates of drug-related offenses (3) and alcohol-related offenses (7).

Recommendations for future actions or changes

- 1. Preserve annual data from 2016 for future year over year comparison.
- 2. Design and implement an assessment to help gauge the effectiveness of the FYE drug and alcohol module.
- 3. Design and implement an assessment to help gauge the effectiveness of the Drug and Alcohol Awareness Week.
